

# Semiconductor Industry Association of Australia (SIAA) – Foundational Rules and Bylaws

## 1. Name and Legal Status

The organization shall be known as the **Semiconductor Industry Association of Australia (SIAA)**. It is a not-for-profit, member-driven association incorporated under Australian law.

## 2. Mission and Objectives

SIAA is dedicated to fostering a robust, innovative, and globally competitive semiconductor ecosystem in Australia. Our objectives include:

- **Advocacy & Support:** Representing the interests of Australia's semiconductor sector to government bodies, industry stakeholders, and international partners.
- **Collaboration:** Facilitating partnerships among industry players, academia, and research institutions to drive innovation and commercialization.
- **Standards and Best Practices:** Promoting the adoption of international standards and best practices to enhance quality and interoperability.
- **Workforce Development:** Supporting education and training initiatives to cultivate a skilled semiconductor workforce.
- **Global Engagement:** Engaging with international semiconductor associations to align on global industry trends and standards.

## 3. Membership

### 3.1 Eligibility

Membership is open to entities and individuals engaged in or supporting the semiconductor industry in Australia, including but not limited to:

- Semiconductor manufacturers and designers
- Equipment and material suppliers
- Research and academic institutions
- Government agencies and policymakers
- Industry consultants and service providers

### 3.2 Membership Categories

- **Corporate Members:** Companies directly involved in semiconductor activities.
- **Associate Members:** Organizations indirectly supporting the semiconductor industry.
- **Academic Members:** Educational and research institutions.

- **Individual Members:** Professionals and experts in the semiconductor field.

### **3.3 Rights and Responsibilities**

Members are entitled to:

- Participate in SIAA events and initiatives
- Vote in general meetings (as per membership category)
- Access industry reports and publications

Members are expected to:

- Uphold the association's mission and values
- Comply with the bylaws and code of conduct
- Pay annual membership dues as determined by the Board

## **4. Governance Structure**

### **4.1 Board of Directors**

The Board shall consist of elected representatives from the membership categories, ensuring diverse representation. Responsibilities include:

- Setting strategic direction
- Overseeing financial management
- Approving major initiatives and policies

### **4.2 Executive Committee**

Comprising the President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer, the Executive Committee manages the day-to-day operations of the association.

### **4.3 Committees and Working Groups**

SIAA may establish specialized committees to focus on areas such as:

- Policy and Advocacy
- Research and Innovation
- Education and Workforce Development
- Standards and Compliance

## **5. Meetings**

### **5.1 Annual General Meeting (AGM)**

An AGM shall be held annually to:

- Present the annual report and financial statements
- Elect Board members
- Discuss and vote on key matters

## **5.2 Special Meetings**

Special meetings may be convened as needed to address urgent or specific issues.

## **6. Financial Management**

- SIAA shall maintain transparent financial records, subject to annual audits.
- Funding sources may include membership dues, grants, sponsorships, and event revenues.
- Financial decisions shall be made in alignment with the association's mission and ethical standards.

## **7. Code of Conduct**

Members and affiliates are expected to:

- Engage in ethical business practices
- Respect intellectual property rights
- Foster an inclusive and collaborative environment
- Avoid conflicts of interest

## **8. Amendments to Bylaws**

Amendments to these bylaws require:

- A proposal submitted by a member in good standing
- Approval by a two-thirds majority vote at an AGM or special meeting

## **9. Dissolution**

In the event of dissolution:

- Remaining assets shall be distributed to one or more not-for-profit organizations with similar objectives
- The decision shall be made by the Board and ratified by the membership

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This foundational document aims to establish a clear governance and operational framework for SIAA, promoting growth and collaboration within Australia's semiconductor industry.

## SIAA Membership Fee Structure (Annual, in AUD) 2025

Membership Category	Annual Fee (AUD)	Notes
<b>Corporate Member – Large</b>	\$5,000	For companies with >100 employees or >\$50M revenue. Includes voting rights, full participation, and branding opportunities.
<b>Corporate Member – Medium</b>	\$2,500	For companies with 21–100 employees or \$5M–\$50M revenue. Voting rights included.
<b>Corporate Member – Small / Startup</b>	\$750	For companies with ≤20 employees or <\$5M revenue. Designed to encourage startups and scale-ups.
<b>Associate Member</b>	\$1,000	For service providers, consultants, or entities adjacent to semiconductor manufacturing. Non-voting.
<b>Academic Member</b>	\$500	For universities, TAFEs, and research institutions. May include limited voting rights depending on structure.
<b>Individual Member</b>	\$150	For professionals, retirees, or consultants without company affiliation. Non-voting.
<b>Student Member</b>	\$30	Must be currently enrolled in a tertiary institution. Non-voting. Access to events and resources.
International Membership Category	Annual Fee (AUD)	Notes
<b>International Corporate Member</b>	\$2,500	For overseas companies directly involved in the semiconductor sector (design, manufacturing, materials, etc.). Includes limited voting rights, access to reports, participation in Australian events, and online networking.
<b>International Associate Member</b>	\$1,200	For overseas service providers, consultants, and adjacent industry players. Non-voting. Access to online content and events.
<b>International Academic/Institutional Member</b>	\$600	For universities and research institutions outside Australia. Access to shared research, policy updates, and collaborative opportunities.
<b>International Individual Member</b>	\$200	For professionals based outside Australia with an interest in the Australian semiconductor sector. Access to webinars, newsletters, and limited networking.
